8. Open question

What can be improved in the future?

- Consultation hours should definitely be fixed every week at the same timeslot and in the same week. For this semester we didn't even have consultation hours for the first 2 exercises, which I think affected the grades, especially for exercise 1.
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- The consultation hour arrangement was bad. We didn't get any help on the first two exercises, so they were very hard to complete. I also think the consultation hours should be scheduled at a fixed time every week, as I

heard they were before.

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- I think that we really needed some extra assistance on the Exercise 2, which was related to the software, but the teaching assistants only started with Exercise 3. The recorded video was very helpful of course, but the problem was that there were a lot of bugs and we didn't know how to make everything work..So it could be nice to have someone who can also help with something like that..
- Lecturing was good!!
-More reference articles are needed.
- 1. Student assistants
 - a. they have to be there from the beginning!
 - b. They should be able to help you when you have a problem, instead of telling us that it is ok resulting in 20% reduced mark
 - c. They are impossible to contact outside the exercise consultation. This was a problem in the beginning.

- As mentioned in #7 I think the compressor part was too much.
 - Perhaps changing the scheduling for the lectures. It may improve participation and the course dynamics.
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 - I think the exercises provided a room for going deeper with the course materials. I think student assistants should have a well scheduled time for assisting with the exercises and that time should not contract with other classes, I mean to be on the timetable as the part of the course timetable.
I also preferred the QUIZ session, may be it is better to have at least four in class quizzes.
